 - a. Discussion/acceptance of Urban Non Point Source & Stormwater Management Grant.**

The Village received a \$113,000 matching grant for stormwater management. Bayside's grant request was rated second out of sixty-one applications. The grant will be used for re-grading the drainage between Ellsworth Park and the 621 pond. It will also be used for the expansion and dredging of the 621 Brown Deer Road pond and surrounding drainage areas. **Acceptance is recommended.**

- b. Discussion/acceptance of Department of Natural Resources Household Hazardous Waste Collection Grant.**

The Village received a matching grant of \$7,000 to host a household hazardous waste collection event. The monies will be used to collect household hazardous waste at the May 3 Community Clean Up Day event. Only two municipalities and ten counties in the State received this award. **Acceptance is recommended.**

- c. Discussion/acceptance of Department of Natural Resources Urban Forestry Grant.**

The Village received a \$25,000 Urban Forestry Grant for the Village's Emerald Ash Borer program. This is a matching grant that will include conducting a tree inventory of public trees, tree planting, and tree removal. **Acceptance is recommended.**

- d. Discussion/acceptance of Prescription Drug Collection Grant.**

Bayside received \$3,500 to collect expired, used or unwanted prescription drugs in the Police Department. Bayside was one of 23 agencies in the State to be granted this prescription drug collection grant. Last year, Bayside collected over 500 pounds of prescription drugs, ranking second, only to the City of Milwaukee in collections. **Acceptance is recommended.**

Manager Pederson stated three bids were received, with Payne and Dolan being the lowest bidder for the project at a total base and alternate bid of \$254,987.35. The project is scheduled to start after the Fourth of July.

Motion by Trustee DeGraff, seconded by Trustee Hersch, to recommend to the Village Board of Trustees approval on the 2014 road repaving project. Motion carried unanimously.

Manager Pederson noted this resolution is part of the Village's sustainability strategic initiative and is part of the Bird City application.

Manager Pederson stated the 2013 DCUS report details the annual time allocation and 2014 reports show that most of DCUS time has been spent on ice and snow. Trustee DeGraff questioned how the Village's salt supply was. Manager Pederson noted there was enough salt for one last snow. Trustee DeGraff stated DCUS Director VanRegenmorter did a great job on the reports.

Manager Pederson stated most accounts are on target for the year. Trustee DeGraff questioned why the Dispatch Contract Services was so high. Manager Pederson noted that most contract agreements were set up to be paid at the beginning of the year.

Manager Pederson noted the current fee schedule was revised to include doubling the Conditional Use Permit fee for businesses that begin operation prior to obtaining approval from the Village and amended the fees for copies to mirror the fees of the North Shore Fire Department.

Motion by Trustee Walny, seconded by Trustee Petersen, to recommend to the Board of Trustees approval on Resolution 14-___, a resolution revising the fee schedule as referenced by the Village of Bayside Municipal Code. Motion carried unanimously.

Manager Pederson stated the changes to the budget reflect transfers from the General Fund to the Long Term Financial Fund, Police Capital and DCUS Capital Fund and are primarily 2013 year-end housekeeping.

Motion by Trustee Hersch, seconded by Trustee Petersen, to recommend to the Board of Trustees approval on Resolution 14 ____, a resolution to amend the 2014 Budget to reflect changes in revenues and expenditures. Motion carried unanimously.

4. Discussion/recommendation on Resolution 14-___, a resolution requesting the State Legislature amend SB 566 to allow sharing of the 911 emergency dispatch fee amongst all consolidated dispatch entities.

Manager Pederson noted this resolution requests the State Legislature amend SB 566 to include allowing multiple PSAP's per county to be able to receive funds.
